

ORDINANCE NO. 1404

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GIG HARBOR,
WASHINGTON, ACCEPTING THE DONATION OF A TWO-
DIMENSIONAL SILHOUETTE OF THE NATIVITY;
PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND ESTABLISHING
AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 35.21.100, the City of Gig Harbor may accept any donations of money or property by ordinance, and may carry out the terms of the donation, if the same are within the powers granted to the City by law; and

WHEREAS, the City has received a request from John Skansi to donate a two-dimensional silhouette depicting the Nativity to be used seasonally for public display at Skansie Park;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GIG HARBOR, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Acceptance of Donation. The City Council hereby accepts the donation from John Skansi of a two-dimensional silhouette depicting the Nativity. Acceptance of these donations in no way obligates the City to display the donations.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect (5) days after passage and publication of an approved summary thereof consisting of the title and is intended to ratify the City's acceptance of the donation from John Skansi on December 1, 2018.
